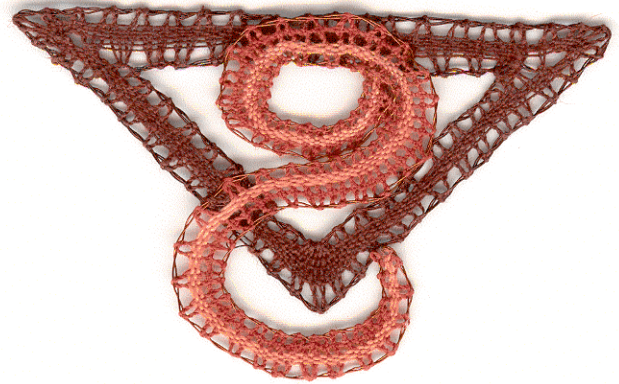


Triangular Pin

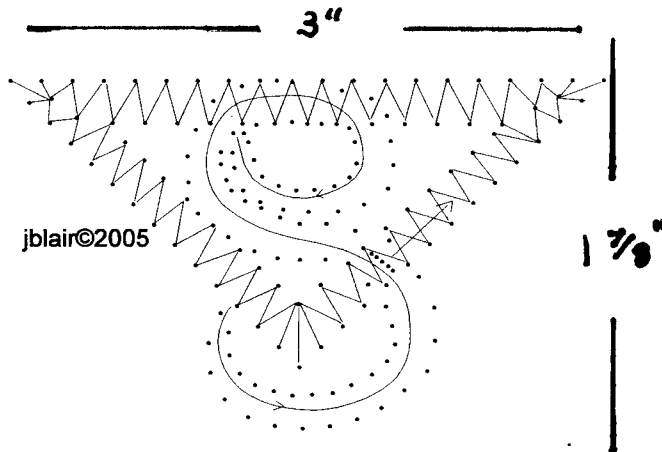

4 prs dark brown linen Brok 35/2 (DB)
2 prs lighter brown linen Brok 35/2 (LB)
2 prs peach linen Brok 35/2 (P)
2 prs brown 30 gauge wire
2 prs bronze 30 gauge wire



Using one pr LB as the worker, 2 pr P for passives, and two prs bronze wire for edge prs, work swirl in cloth stitch (ctc), adding 1 pr LB as it widens, this pr is worked in wholestitch (ctct). Make a turning stitch to keep the wire at the edges (cttc). Leave out LB passive as the work narrows. Make sewings on the top half to the earlier part.

Start DB triangle behind the center of the swirl and work in cloth stitch using two prs of brown wire for edges, making sewings into the swirl where the two pieces meet. After the piece is off the pillow attach a pin fastener to the back behind the top black cloth stitch area.



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
